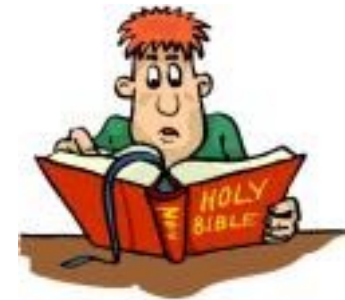

Time with the Lord

Listening to God and talking to God, day by day

*Begin by selecting a time - about 15 minutes when you can realistically expect to have some time alone.

*Read the chapters indicated by month & date.

* Ask God to “speak” to you as you read His Word.

* While reading, something may make an impression on you. - make a note of it in a small notebook or memo pad.

* Talk back to God. The Bible calls that kind of talking back “prayer.”

* Read day by day. Respond to God by praying or “talking back.”

* If you miss a day or so. Just pick up on the proper day (Don’t feel guilty about missing). You will probably feel “hungry” or “empty”. The Lord will be there, waiting for you - eager to speak to you and listen to you.

Bible Reading: Quiet Time with God You do not hurry. You are meeting a Person. You expect God to impress you with something from the Scriptures that you personally need that day. Over a period of time you may detect a pattern or certain emphasis. Don’t become involved in the details as much as the overall theme of the chapter or book. Reading helps sharpen your familiarity with the characters and stories of both the Old and New Testaments.

Reading can be compared to flying over a city in an airplane. We see the general layout and landmarks. It is meant to be fun and refreshing. It should be uplifting - probably not some deep theological concept. Leave that for Bible Study which is more exacting and technical. As we read with an open heart to God, our thoughts, desires and motivations are purified. Bible reading helps accomplish Paul’s advice to us; *“Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind (thinking process).”* Romans 12:2
